Organisation Overview:

The Canadian Coalition for Green Health Care (the Coalition) is Canada's premier green health care resource network. The Coalition supports the Canadian health care sector to integrate environmentally-responsible practices into the delivery of health care. Position Overview:

The primary task of the Junior Environmental Dashboard Developer is to work with a senior Software Engineer to develop a new web application that will gradually replace a legacy Excel program known as the Green Hospital Scorecard.

- Phase I of the project is to migrate the existing data visualization from Excel charts and tables into a dashboard in the web application. The existing data visualization is written in VBA in Excel.
- Phase II of the project is to migrate electronic data collection from a third-party survey platform to the new web application in order to integrate an ETL pipeline that will clean, transform, and summarize data into KPIs for visualization purpose.

The successful candidate will need to work with high-level guidance and under minimal supervision. The successful candidate will work with the Microsoft toolset, including Azure, .NET Core, .NET MVC, SQL Server relational database and possibly NoSQL, and also frontend framework like JQuery and Bootstrap. The key to the success of the project is attention to details, particularly with data validation.

The successful candidate will be part of a team which administered the scorecard program to the health care sector and work under the leadership of a senior software engineer. As such our new team member will learn to be a team player, be an active listener, to have a growth mindset, be adaptive and be open to constructive feedback. The scorecard team will mentor the new team member to acquire a growth mindset and be receptive and understanding of their own emotional intelligence, and that of others on the team.
