


#### The Heat Doctor initiative...

In the Fall/Winter of 2010, the first "Heat Doctor" appointment was piloted with the carpentry team in NE4. It was a great success and realized savings of approximately 270 GJ of natural gas (equivalent to 658 BBQ tanks) and 14 tonnes of CO2eq!

# **Next Steps...**

Many changes were made to the heating systems assessed by the Heat Doctor. Savings were not as good as expected compared to those achieved in the NE4 pilot. A meeting was held between Adrian Lee (Maintenance Manager) and Andrea Linsky (Energy Specialist) to review results. The lower than expected savings were attributed to differences between how we did the changes in NE4 compared to the other buildings.

As a result of this experience, the following actions are recommended for winter 2012-13:

- Open door setback temperatures for all buildings to be decreased from 12 to 10°C.
- All heaters in building (as opposed to only a few) to be linked to the garage door sensors. This will ensure that heaters not linked to sensors are not increasing gas usage when garage doors open.
